

Emergency Number Cyprus | Complete List of Police, Ambulance, Fire & All Hotlines



Emergency situations can happen anywhere and at any time, so having the right emergency number in Cyprus immediately available can save lives. This page gathers all major emergency services, hotlines, hospitals, utility emergency lines and support services in one place, making it easier for residents, visitors and businesses to find help fast. Always call 112 or 199 for life-threatening emergencies.

Core national emergency numbers — use these for life-threatening situations

- <u>112</u> Universal EU emergency number (Police, Ambulance, Fire). Free, works from any phone, 24/7.
- 199 Cyprus national emergency number (Police, Ambulance, Fire). Alternative to 112.

When to call <u>112</u> / <u>199</u>: serious injuries, unconsciousness, major traffic accidents, fires, crimes in progress, medical collapse — anything life-threatening.

- **Poison control:** 1401 chemical and poisoning incidents.
- **Drug abuse / narcotics:** <u>1498</u> reporting and emergency assistance for substance-related incidents.

- 1441 Search & Rescue (sea and aviation incidents).

Utilities: electricity, water, gas emergencies

- Electricity (EAC) emergency / faults: 1800 report power cuts and dangerous fallen lines. Official: https://www.eac.com.cy/EN
- Water supply emergencies: varies by district example Nicosia Water Services: +357 22 698 000 (check local municipality for your district).
- Gas leak / gas emergency: contact your gas supplier or municipality emergency office immediately (number varies by supplier/region).

- 11892 Night / duty pharmacy information (find nearest open pharmacy).

Transport & road assistance

- For road accidents with injuries: call 112 / 199 immediately.
- For non-injury incidents, insurance, or towing: check your insurer's 24/7 road assistance number or local police non-emergency line.

Step-by-step: what to do when you call an emergency number in Cyprus

- 1. Stay calm and speak clearly.
- 2. **Give exact location first:** street name, number, landmark, or GPS coordinates. If at sea, give boat name and coordinates.
- 3. **State the nature of the emergency:** medical, fire, crime, accident, gas leak, etc.
- 4. Estimate number of people involved and injuries.
- 5. **Mention hazards:** smoke, fire spread, electricity downed lines, chemical smell, gas leak.
- 6. **Follow the dispatcher's instructions exactly.** They may give life-saving guidance.
- 7. Remain on the call until the dispatcher confirms it's OK to hang up.

FAQ Section

What is the main emergency number in Cyprus?

The main emergency number in Cyprus is **112**, which connects you to police, ambulance and fire services. It is free, works from any phone and supports multiple languages.

Should I call 112 or 199 in Cyprus?

Both numbers connect to the same emergency services.

- * 112 → European emergency number (works even with no credit or SIM).
- * **199** → Cyprus national emergency hotline.

Most visitors and locals use 112.

Are emergency numbers in Cyprus free to call?

Yes.

All emergency numbers in Cyprus, including 112, 199, 1407, 1441 and 1401, are **free of charge** from landlines and mobile phones.

Do emergency numbers work from mobile phones in Cyprus?

Yes.

You can call emergency numbers from any mobile network, even with:

- * no credit
- * a locked phone
- * no SIM card (112 only)

What emergency number should tourists use in Cyprus?

Tourists should dial **112**, the universal European emergency number. Operators can usually assist in English and other languages.

What is the emergency number for forest fires in Cyprus?

For forest fires, call the **Forest Fire Hotline 1407**, available 24/7.

What number do I call for sea or air rescue in Cyprus?

Sea and air emergencies are handled through **1441**, the Search and Rescue Coordination Centre.

What is the main emergency number in Cyprus?

The main emergency number in Cyprus is 112, which connects you to police, ambulance and fire services. It is free, works from any phone and supports multiple languages.

Is there a poison control emergency number in Cyprus?

Yes.

Cyprus Poison Information Line: 1401.

What number should I call for domestic violence or family protection?

For domestic violence emergencies, call 1440.

For child protection issues, call **1466**.

Is the 112 emergency number available everywhere in Cyprus?

Yes.

112 works across the entire island, including rural villages, highways, mountain areas and tourist resorts.

Do Cyprus emergency numbers work with foreign SIM cards?

Yes.

112 and 199 work with all roaming SIM cards automatically.

What should I do if I cannot speak Greek?

Call 112 — it provides multilingual assistance, often including English, Russian and other major languages.
